HOW TO PRAY FOR PEOPLE

I would like to share with you some ways/reasons of how to pray for the people who come to receive prayer after our preaching.

Allow the Holy Spirit to lead you how to pray and what to pray. Also for which person to pray. Do not feel pressured to pray in the order they passed but in the order that the Holy Spirit directs you.

Some pass with a sure faith, while the faith of others increases while spending time in front of the altar.

Remember that you are the intercessor, the one who stands in the gap for them, not the one who performs miracles.

When you pray for them, show compassion.

Luke 7:12-13 "Now when he came nigh to the gate of the city, behold, there was a dead man carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow: and much people of the city was with her. And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her, and said unto her, Weep not." KJV

Matthew 14:14 "And Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and he healed their sick." KJV

The physical touch.

Touch is very necessary because it shows our humanity and connects us with the person..

Matthew 20:30-34

"And, behold, two blind men sitting by the way side, when they heard that Jesus passed by, cried out, saying, Have mercy on us, O Lord, thou son of David.

And the multitude rebuked them, because they should hold their peace: but they cried the more, saying, Have mercy on us, O Lord, thou son of David.

And Jesus stood still, and called them, and said, What will ye that I shall do unto you?

They say unto him, Lord, that our eyes may be opened.

So Jesus had compassion on them, and touched their eyes: and immediately their eyes received sight, and they followed him." KJV

God uses your hands to heal the sick.

Mark 16:18 "They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; **they shall** lay hands on the sick, and they shall recover." KJV

Encourage them to believe.

Matthew 9:20

"And, behold, a woman, which was diseased with an issue of blood twelve years, came behind him, and touched the hem of his garment:

For she said within herself, If I may but touch his garment, I shall be whole.

But Jesus turned him about, and when he saw her, he said, Daughter, be of good comfort; thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour." KJV
